




JeffCo Prison Ministry

I contacted Father Garrou who manages the JEFFCO prison ministry. Fr. Garrou says there are three areas of ministry to which our members can volunteer their time and talents: 1) Chapel services, 2)

Religious Education (RE), and 3) Book cart distributions. For the chapel services, extraordinary ministers (EMs) are needed to distribute communion, and anyone with a musical talent can support by playing music during communion distribution. The RE has opportunities for our members to lead Bible study classes, for those who are willing and able. And the book cart distribution involves handing out rosaries and Bibles from a cart to those who have requested them.

Any and all volunteers will undergo a background check and an interview before having access to the ministry. Those accepted will begin with an orientation visit followed by "shadowing" a veteran volunteer to "learn the ropes". All volunteers need to begin by emailing Fr. Garrou at DGarrou@JEFFCO.US. Father Garrou will then get an application to the volunteers to begin the process.

Corporate Communion
