2016 Tootsie Roll Program Wrap-up by Dave Schneider, Program Director

In 2016 our solicitations at the 3 local King Soopers stores and Our Lady of Fatima church resulted in donations totaling \$2,755.64. This was 31% less than we took in during our 2015 campaign and I am not able to explain the reduction except to say that we did have one store on a Saturday where we had no volunteers to work the store. Hopefully we can do better next year with the continual growth of the council membership.

We will be sending a check to the Colorado State Council for the entire \$2,755.64 amount and they will take 25% (\$688.91) off the top for use in those parts of the state where there is no Knights of Columbus presence. We will also send the State Council the names of the organizations we want the remaining money to be given to and the State Council will write checks for those organizations and send them to us for forwarding to the respective organizations. At our November business meeting, we decided to divide up the remaining amount (\$2,066.73) evenly between four organizations, giving each \$516.68. Those organizations are:

<u>Carron Coffee House</u>: Provide entertainment to the developmentally disabled on Friday evenings at Light of the World in Littleton.

<u>Havern School</u>: Started by the Sisters of Loretto in 1963 and located in Littleton, provide an education for elementary and middle school students with learning disabilities.

<u>Margaret Walters Center</u>: Provide therapeutic recreation for the developmentally disabled adults.

<u>Steamer's Coffee House/Jack's Bar & Grill</u>: A privately-owned restaurant and coffeehouse in Arvada that employs a large percentage of individuals from the "Intellectual/developmentally disabled" community.

If you worked the tootsie rolls this year, give yourself a big pat on the back for your support of a most worthy cause.

I would like to address the reasons I have heard to not take the next step to the 4th Degree:

Another monthly meeting (don't have time)

Mother Teresa Assembly meets the first Thursday of the month, the meeting is opened with the rosary, and then a business meeting that usually last less than 1 hour.

The expense of becoming a 4th Degree Knight (can't afford it)

There are expenses to become a 4th Degree Knight, first of all, the uniform of a 4th Degree Knight is a tuxedo. Yes there is an expense, but most spouses really enjoy their husband looking really good in a tux. If you opt to join the Honor Guard, there is an expense involved. We have set a fund at 2551 to help Sir Knights purchase their regalia and pay back in an affordable / timely manner.

More activities, to take me away from family

The 4th degree Knights activity is generally service to fellow Knights at funerals, weddings and special events that require an Honor Guards. The Sir Knights are also involved in actions/ events regarding Patriotism. The assembly does not hold fund raiser or work groups, like Councils.

Another annual dues.

Our dues are \$20 annually and we ask for an additional \$10 for the regalia fund.
