

A Word from the Financial Secretary

Brothers, the end of our fraternal year comes at the end of this month, and with it, another milestone for me. It marks (approximately) one year since I started in this position. If figure now is a good a time as ever to reflect back on this year. While most of what I do is, by necessity, behind the scenes, I'd like to share a few of the changes I've made for the council, all in the interest of strengthening our financial resources.

First and foremost, and guided by our immediate past Financial Secretary Dale Culuris, we have transitioned to fully utilizing the system set up by Supreme for accounting of all transactions. The benefit of this transition is two-fold. First, it guides our accounting to smooth all financial reporting. Second, it permits us to perform a "three-way-match" between the receipts, bank statements, and the Supreme system. All of this has made reporting and auditing much easier.

Next, we have automated the completion of Supreme, State, and IRS forms. With the structure provided by the Supreme system, each transaction is coded to ensure it all totals per IRS and Supreme requirements. To illustrate, our IRS filing (30 pages of government forms) was completed in January, while many councils are filing for extensions because of the complexity.

Finally, something for the near future. While the Knights are a non-profit corporation, our classification does not allow us to directly issue charitable contribution documents to individual donors. However, Supreme has provided us with clear guidance that will allow us to serve as a "pass-through" for charitable donations. This will allow us to proudly advertise that donations through our fundraising are tax-deductible.

As I said in my first article as Financial Secretary, I hope I can fulfill my role through enabling the creativity and passion of our council. If you have an idea for raising, using, or organizing our financial resources, feel free to get in touch with me. I'd love to be of help. Vivat Jesus!

Ultrasound Dedication

On Wednesday, May 17th, PGK Michael Majeres traveled to Longmont in order to represent the council at the formal dedication of the ultrasound machine our council purchased with the proceeds from our 2016 "Cheers! To Life" dinner. The machine was blessed by a local priest, and our partners at Life Choices talked about how they are using the machine to increase the number of women and families they serve in their advocacy of life programs. The PGK shared a little about our event and our honoree, Drake Durkee. Michael Beiriger represented the State Deputy in presenting a symbolic check for the purchase price. This is the same machine that visited OLF after Masses on June 4th. We are hoping to partner with Life Choices again for the proceeds of the 2017 event.
