



#### Star Council Award

One of the most coveted awards a council can receive is the Star Council Award. The Supreme Council presents this award to those councils who meet all of the following requirements during the fraternal year: 1) Qualify for the Fr.



McGivney Award by increasing council membership by at least 7% (five for our council) and hosting four 1<sup>st</sup> degree exemplifications, 2) qualify for the Columbian Award by reporting at least four activities in the six program areas, and 3) qualify for the Founders Award by increasing the number of insured members in our council by at least 3% (three for our council).

Even though we met the first two criteria, we were unable to meet the third due to the loss of our council's insurance agent and the death of our General Agent, Doug Parsons. Knowing how hard we worked during the year to achieve what we did, I was a bit dismayed that we failed to earn Star Council for a reason beyond our control. So in July, I wrote a letter to Supreme, explaining our council's situation and requesting that our council be eligible for the Star Council Award. Several months had passed without hearing back from Supreme, but last month we received a notice from Supreme that they were granting a ONE TIME adjustment and awarding our council both the Founder's Award and the Star Council Award. Sometimes the squeaky wheel does get the grease! Everyone who worked



to help us achieve Star Council should take a second to pat themselves on the back and recognize that we received an award that is only given to a select few number of councils. WELL DONE BROTHER KNIGHTS!!!

### Knights Stand Up for the Disabled Mary, God Bearer, Ark Tootsie Roll Wrap-Up

On October 25/26. we concluded our 2014 Campaign for Persons with



Intellectual Disabilities (better known as the Tootsie Roll Program) by soliciting donations outside the church after all Masses. That weekend, we collected \$155.28. During the entire campaign, we netted a grand total of \$3,045.19. The State Council will distribute 25% of this to organizations in the parts of Colorado where the Knights of Columbus presence is low or nonexistent. The remaining \$2,283.89 will go to organizations of our Last year, we gave to Carron Coffee House, Havern School, DDRC, Margaret Walters Center, and Steamer's Coffee House/Jack's Bar & Grill. At the November business meeting, we will be voting on the organizations we will support this year. If you have ideas to share, please be sure you are in attendance at the meeting.

I want to thank all brothers who participated in the campaign soliciting donations, transporting supplies, and handling the collected money. I want to send a special "Thank You" to brother Stan Collins who headed up the program this year and ensured we had the needed workers at the different stores. Thanks, Stan, for all your hard work and a job well done!

#### **Upcoming Major Degree Exemplifications**


There will be a Major Degree (2nd and 3rd) Exemplification in Loveland on Saturday, Nov 8. Registration starts at

# of the Covenant

by Michael Daly The Blessed Virgin Mary truly is the Ark of the New Covenant! She carried Jesus, the fulfillment of everything that God the Father foreshadowed in the Testament, and prepared the



world, to receive Jesus. The Ark of the Covenant, carried by the Israelites contained three things (Heb 9:3-5): The 10 Commandments inscribed on two stone tablets (Ex 20:1-17), a pot of manna, bread from heaven (Ex 16:4-31), and Aaron's budding staff (Num 17:1-10). In the Blessed Virgin Mary's womb she carried Jesus, the fulfillment of the ancient Ark: Jesus fulfilled the law (Mt 5:3-11.17), called Himself the bread from Heaven (Jn 6:22-59), and is the Tree of Life (Gen 2:9; Rev 22). By this reflection, may we recommit our "Yes", to be more perfect, as Mary made her "Yes" to the Lord. As a knight, may we realize the presence of Jesus in our entire self, so that those whom we support through our ministries come to know the Holy Trinity more fully.
