



INSIDE LOOK FROM OUR FINANCIAL SECRETARY

This month's installment of "Inside Look" features the Benefits of Being a Financial Secretary. This is just one part of a recurring article series that seeks to expose everyone in the council to the work of a Financial Secretary. Please feel free to contact me at marcus.ritosa@gmail.com if you have any clarifying questions. It is often said that the most important role in the Council is that of Financial Secretary. It may be an honor to be asked to this post, but it is more a responsibility than a pleasure. Without the strong financial backbone to the council (provided through the Financial Secretary), its programs shrivel, its respect is revoked, and we simply can't reach our mission. I, personally, have appreciated taking on this role as an organizational challenge and an opportunity to see the nuts and bolts of everything we do.

It must also be said that a Financial Secretary is the only paid member of the council leadership. The Financial Secretary receives an annual compensation of \$0.40 per active insurance policy per year. In addition, and based on Council 9597 Bylaws, the Financial Secretary is paid 8% of all Dues collected. In total, this amounts to about \$250 for the year.

Finally, the Financial Secretary is the official designated Supreme representative to each council. As such, it is solemn charge of the FS to safeguard the financial stability of the council, especially when it means disagreeing with any council decision, even if supported by the Grand Knight.
